Shelly Masur holds a Master's Degree on Public Health and has over 15 years of experience in adolescent health and youth services. She is the President of the Redwood City Elementary District School Board and recently joined the John W. Gardner Center for Youth & Their Communities at Stanford as Director of Community Youth Development Programs. Prior to the Gardner Center, Shelly was the Sr. Director of After School Programs for Girls Inc. of Alameda County. She has also served as a consultant for the ACLU of Northern California and the California Coalition for Reproductive Freedom where she worked on issues around adolescent reproductive health and family communication. Shelly was also the director of the Adolescent Health Collaborative (AHC), a public-private partnership working to improve the health and well-being of teens in California and the Associate Director of the Teen Pregnancy Coalition of San Mateo County where she focused on sexuality education, youth advocacy, and teen pregnancy prevention. She served on the San Mateo County Childhood Obesity Taskforce as the co-Chair of the School Wellness Policy Group as well as on the Advisory Council. Shelly is a member of the California School Board Association's School Health Advisory Council. She also sat on the Board of Directors of the Society for Public Health Educators, has presented at numerous conferences, and serves as a reviewer for two peer-reviewed journals.
